Sr. No.	Particulars	Details
1.	Name(s) of the opposing party	There are 2 litigations which are initiated against the Company and the Opposing Parties in said litigations are as under: 1. Mr. Ram Sarup Sharma; Mr. Vikas Sharma; and Mr. Vineet Sharma (“ Litigation 1 ”) 2. Mr. Ghanshyam Devnani (“ Litigation 2 ”)
2.	Court/Tribunal/Agency where the litigation is filed	1. Litigation 1 is before District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Delhi; and 2. Litigation 2 is before District Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Gurugram.
3.	Brief details of dispute/litigation	1. Litigation 1 is filed against 3 different hospitals (including Artemis Hospital, Sector-51, Gurugram) and its doctors under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 alleging medical negligence. 2. Litigation 2 is filed by close relatives of Patient under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 against Artemis Hospital, Sector- 51, Gurugram and the concerned doctors alleging medical negligence in providing treatment to Patient.
4.	Expected financial implications, if any, due to compensation, penalty etc.	The expected financial implication cannot be determined at this stage as the matters are at an initial stage before the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commissions. The Company does not foresee any material impact of these litigations on its business operations.
5.	Quantum of claims, if any	Total quantum of claims for said litigations amounts to ~Rs. 4.74 Crore, however the final impact in monetary terms will be known only when the matters are finally disposed off.
